Accordance: Pursuant to Article 33 of the Statute for Prevention and Control of Infectious Animal Disease

Details:

1. Recognized foot and mouth disease, rinderpest, contagious bovine pleuropneumonia, African swine fever, glanders, highly pathogenic avian influenza, Newcastle disease, and rabies free countries (zones) are listed in Table 1, “List of the recognized foot and mouth disease, rinderpest, contagious bovine pleuropneumonia, African swine fever, glanders, highly pathogenic avian influenza, Newcastle disease, and rabies free countries (zones).” Countries (zones) not listed in Table 1 are regarded as disease-status unknown or disease-infected countries (zone). The importation of articles subject to animal quarantine from countries (zones) where not listed in Table 1, shall

comply with the “Quarantine Requirements for the Importation of Animals and Animal Products” and its relevant regulations on disease-infected countries (zones).

2. Modification of countries (zones) with incidences of bovine spongiform encephalopathy is listed in Table 2, “List of countries (zones) with incidences of bovine spongiform encephalopathy.” No domestic/wild bovine, meat-and-bone meal, meat meal, bone meal, poultry meal, blood meal, animal fat and oil for feed, animal greaves for feed, bovine serum, and ovine/caprine serum or other animal products that may transmit bovine spongiform encephalopathy originated from the listed countries (zones) are allowed to import into the Republic of China.
3. Any shipment of animals and animal products that is loaded on board for the Republic of China prior to the effective date of this announcement will remain eligible for export to the Republic of China.
