6.	Description of content: The Requirements cover animal health control and regulate the importation of live crustaceans and molluscs. These requirements have been implemented since 1 September 2011. This amendment also revises the list of susceptible species of crayfish plaque, and the name of a mollusc disease in accordance with the OIE Aquatic Animal Health Code (2013 version). The susceptible species of crayfish plaque which had been listed in table 1 of the Requirements ( <i>Astacus astacus, Astacus leptodactylus, Austropotamobius pallipes</i> , etc.) have been expanded to include three crayfish families (Cambaridae, Astacidae and Parastacidae). Infection with abalone herpes-like virus (listed in table 2 of the Requirements) is also revised as Infection with abalone herpesvirus. Excluding table 1 and table 2 of the Requirements, the other part of the Requirements remain unchanged.
